## WHY THE LOCAL LABOR MARKET WORKSHOP?



As the pace of the labor market change accelerates, more and more graduates find themselves dealing with JOB SHOCK! Our schools do a fine job of equipping students with academic skills, but many times, student preparation for employment in the “real world” is insufficient. Many students have part-time jobs while in school, but that’s not quite the same as the demands of full-time employment that students will face. Finding ways to assist our young people to make the transition from school-to-work is critical as we move into the future.

The UNI Center for Economic Education, through the sponsorship of selected Cedar Valley businesses, is again offering a one-week workshop to help area teachers at all levels become familiar with the local labor market.

## WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES....

The objectives of this program are to help teachers:

- Understand employment requirements of firms in the Cedar Valley
- Understand the forces driving the local labor market in the Cedar Valley
- Understand the issues of school-to-work in the nation and in Iowa
- Develop materials that can be used to raise student understanding of the workplace
- Exchange information and network among educators and business leaders

**This workshop, which carries graduate credit, is being offered July 6-10, 2009.** Teachers will receive two hours credit in 920:133g, the Local Labor Market Workshop. Due to generous underwriting from our business partners, tuition for participants is only \$120.
