The term globalization means different things to different people; it usually encompasses many economic and public policy issues. This two-day workshop takes a closer look at the current international trade patterns; debates over the benefits and costs of free trade; policies that limit trade to promote “fair” trade; the changing distribution of income and wealth across nations, and across workers with different education and skill levels within particular nations; the role of the leading international institutions that promote international trade and development; and the government’s role in assisting workers and/or firms that are adversely affected by international trade. All of the lessons demonstrated in the workshop are designed for use in the classroom ranging from economics , history, geography, government/civics, or contemporary issues courses. Each workshop participant will receive a free copy of Focus Globalization prepared by the CEE for classroom use.
